To some he is a novelty and they don't want to touch him for fear of being scratched. Our grandchildren love him, but when they were little we had to caution them to pat his head first and not just grab him anywhere. He wants to recognize who is patting him before he can relax.

God remains a mystery to many people. They look for Him, but don't recognize Him when they see Him. Others approach God as a novelty not wanting to get too close, but still wanting to say they know Him. God is not hiding, He wants us to come to Him, talk to Him, worship Him and Love Him. **1 John 4:19** We love because he first loved us.

Various authors claim there are between 5,000 and 7,000 promises in the Bible. The Dictionary of Bible Themes counts 5,467. We can't claim the promises we don't know about for a promise unclaimed is usually a promise unfulfilled. This Sunday we will explore the promise of the Holy Spirit in the life of each believer (1 Corinthians 12:1-13).

Paul asked some disciples in Ephesus, "Did you receive the Holy Spirit when you believed?" They answered, "No, we have not even heard that there is a Holy Spirit." (Acts 19:2) How about you? Have you heard that God's Holy Spirit dwells in every believer and desires to give gifts to those who seek Him?

Our grandchildren desperately want a cat or dog of their own, but, unfortunately their mother is allergic. They teased and teased leading up to Christmas, but to no avail. They have to make do with visiting our cat and their other grandparents' dog. How desperate are we for the promises and gifts of God? Do we earnestly seek spiritual gifts of service?

We don't have to beg or tease God to receive the Gift of the Holy Spirit. God's gifts are not for personal gain or prestige within the church. While we are blessed and strengthened in our Christian walk by the Holy Spirit, God's gifts of ministry are for the growth and blessing of all his people. They come with responsibility. Are you anxious to see God working in your life, your church and in the lives of people you know and pray for? Then eagerly desire the gifts God has for you, set your heart on being filled with the Holy Spirit (1 Corinthians 12:31).
